

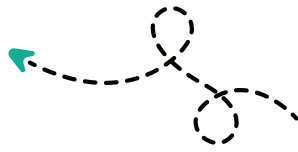

When Miguel Rodriguez was a young boy in Los Angeles, he was very shy. He had a slight speech impairment and found it difficult to communicate with others. His parents worried about how their son would get along in school. But all that changed one day in the second grade.

Miguel saw some of his classmates playing soccer and decided to join them. "It was like someone flipped a switch," his mother said. Miguel opened up. His speech **impairment** disappeared, and Miguel became a successful and popular student.

Like Miguel, soccer has changed the lives of many people around the world. Whether giving a shy kid a way to open up to others, or helping homeless kids find a way to get off the streets, soccer has become an international language that speaks louder than words.

One of the reasons that soccer has been able to cross borders so easily is that the rules are the same, no matter where you are. Even if the teams come from all over the globe, **they** all share common rules and traditions relating to the game. After all, a yellow card means the same thing whether you are from Taiwan, the U.S., Brazil, or Italy. Some other reasons for the universal popularity of soccer may be the fact that its rules are relatively simple compared to many other sports, and because it can be played anywhere from a city park to an international stadium.

Just as Miguel Rodriguez was able to use soccer to communicate with other kids, soccer matches both big and small bring people together from all over the world. The FIFA World Cup, the largest soccer competition in the world, has seen 76 nations compete over its history. It is estimated that almost 3.2 billion people around the world watched at least one minute of the 2010 World Cup. That was approximately 46% of the whole world population which was a record no other sporting competition could even come close to. Moreover, the official attendance for the final world cup match held in 2010 at the Soccer City Stadium in Johannesburg, South Africa between Spain and the Netherlands was about 85.000 people. That was about one-ninth of the world's entire population. With those kinds of numbers, it's no surprise that soccer has become an international language.







VI- Reading Comprehension: (110 Marks)

Read the following passage carefully, then answer the questions below:

After returning to Europe, a Swiss scientist was reported to be suffering from Ebola disease. This was the first case reported in 15 years. Further investigations revealed that the scientist might have been exposed to the virus while studying unexplained deaths among the chimpanzees in the west coast of Africa in November 1994. In April 1995, a medical worker died in a hospital and so did his doctor. The nurse who cared for them died too. Now, the population of Kikwit, a town in Zaire, Africa, is threatened with the killer disease - the Ebola virus.

The Ebola virus and its related strains were first seen in 1976 in Sudan. In that year, 280 people died in a village near the Ebola River from which the virus got its name. The Ebola virus is one of the most mysterious and deadliest killers. It kills 90 per cent of the victims who are infected. It is spread through direct contact with infected blood and other body fluids. Symptoms of the disease are fever, headache, violent diarrheas, vomiting and weakness. Death finally occurs in the second week when blood pours out from the eyes, ears and nose.

There is still no vaccine for the virus but the symptoms can be kept under control. People can avoid catching the disease by not travelling to areas where the virus is found. Health care workers can prevent infection by wearing masks, gloves, and goggles whenever they come into contact with people who may have Ebola. The government in Zaire put spot checks and road blocks to stop the spread of the virus. Air and sea ports around the world like the US, Thailand, Turkey, Taiwan, Egypt, United Arab Emirates and Yemen have also taken steps to reduce the spread of the Ebola virus. The bodies of people who have died of Ebola are still contagious. Specially organized and trained teams should bury the remains, using appropriate safety equipment. People who suspect that they have been exposed to Ebola virus are likely to seek immediate medical attention and should be taken care of immediately if they develop any symptoms in order to prevent any further spread of the disease.

Fortunately, the Ebola virus is now stable with no new cases reported. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), the deadly Ebola virus does not pose a serious international risk.

"Koko" was a female gorilla. She was known for having learned a large number of hand signs from American Sign Language. Koko was able to understand more than 1,000 signs of what Patterson, her instructor and trainer, calls "Gorilla Sign Language". Koko was born at the San Francisco Zoo and lived most of her life in California. Koko gained public attention in the broadcast media because she adopted a kitten as a pet. Koko was also known for meeting many celebrities.


In contrast to other experiments attempting to teach sign language to non-humans, Patterson at the same time, exposed Koko to spoken English from an early age. Patterson reported that Koko understood approximately 2,000 words of spoken English, in addition to the signs. It is generally accepted that she did not use grammar, and that her use of language did not exceed that of a young human child.

A researcher said that Koko asked for a cat in 1983. Ron Cohn, a biologist, explained that when she was given a lifelike stuffed animal, she was less than satisfied. She did not play with it and continued to sign "sad". So on her birthday in July 1984, she was able to choose a kitten. Koko selected a gray male and named him "All Ball". Koko cared for the kitten as if it was a baby gorilla. They said that she tried to nurse "All Ball" and was very gentle and loving.

In December 1984, "All Ball" escaped from Koko's cage and was hit and killed by a car. Later, Patterson said that when she signed to Koko that "All Ball" had been killed, Koko signed "Bad, sad, bad, cry, frown, sad". Patterson also reported later hearing Koko making a sound similar to human weeping.

Koko died in her sleep during the morning of June 19, 2018, at the Gorilla Foundation's preserve in Woodside, California, at the age of 46. The Gorilla Foundation released a statement that "Her impact has been very deep and what she has taught us about the emotions of gorillas and their mental abilities will continue to shape the world."

Since then, our understanding of animal intelligence and emotional capabilities has grown. Koko was a huge part of this change in viewpoint. Since "Project Koko" began in 1972, she challenged our ideas on what animals are capable of.

The growing rates of accidents involving teenagers have been a major concern in the USA, which seeks to limit this fatal phenomenon by all means.

There are different opinions and feelings regarding teen drivers. For the teen driver, there are feelings of excitement, independence and, perhaps, responsibility. For the parents of the teenage driver, there are feelings of worry, responsibility and, for many parents, terror.


According to car crash statistics, teenagers aged 16 to 19 have the highest annual accident rates and traffic violations of any other age group. Traffic accidents are the main cause of death among teenagers in the USA. Adult drivers are often alarmed by the careless driving of young novice drivers who are more likely to engage in risky behaviours like speeding, running red lights, violating traffic signs and signals, making illegal turns, overtaking dangerously, and failure to stop to pedestrians.

There are many reasons why teen drivers are more likely to be involved in traffic accidents. Distractions such as the use of cell phones and loud music from radios, CDs and MP3 players require a teenage driver to take their eyes off the road and focus their attention on the device itself. The desire to show off is another important factor. As soon as teenagers get their license, **they** want to share their driving experiences with friends. Most friends may actually encourage the driver to drive recklessly or make poor driving decisions. Many teenagers feel overconfident and do not take driving risks seriously enough. 



Green tea is more than just green liquid. It is the healthiest beverage on earth. It is loaded with antioxidants and nutrients that have powerful effects on the body. This includes improved brain function, fat loss, a lower risk of cancer and many other incredible benefits. Green tea, however, has its risks, but its benefits are still more than any risk.

Compounds in green tea can improve brain function and make you smarter. The key active ingredient is caffeine. The caffeine amount in green tea, which is not as much as in coffee, is enough to produce a response without causing the nervous effects associated with too much caffeine. Caffeine consistently leads to improvements in various aspects of brain function, including improved mental vigilance, reaction time and memory. Because of the smaller dose of caffeine, green tea can give you a much milder and different kind of “excitement” than coffee. Many people report having more stable energy and being much more productive when they drink green tea compared to coffee.

Green tea increases fat burning and improves physical performance. If you look at the ingredients list for any fat burning drink, green tea will have good chances to be there. In a study on ten healthy men, green tea increased energy spending by 4%, which led to an increase in the burning of fat. Caffeine, itself, has been shown to improve physical performance by preparing fatty acids to be used as energy.

Antioxidants in green tea may lower your risk of various types of cancer. Cancer is uncontrolled growth of cells. Green tea is an excellent source of powerful antioxidants, which can have a **preventive** effect and may stop the development of cancer. Multiple observational studies show that green tea drinkers are significantly less likely to get various types of cancer. It is important to keep in mind that it may be a bad idea to put milk in your tea, because **it** can reduce the antioxidant value.

Green tea may have its risks. In some people, it can cause stomach upset. It has also been reported to cause liver problems in rare cases. Green tea is possibly unsafe when taken in high doses (more than 4 cups a day). It can cause side effects because of the caffeine. These side effects include headache, nervousness, sleep problems, irregular heart beat and dizziness. It also seems to decrease the amount of calcium in the body.
