Little libraries of all shapes and sizes have popped up in recent years. They might be found on street corners. Or they might be found on sidewalks. Often, they are built by community members. They are hoping to share their book collection with their neighbours. These "Little Free Libraries" are like a modern-day bookmobile. Minneapolis, Minnesota, even held the first Little Free Library Festival. Book fans and people with a do-it-yourself element came together. They promoted reading in their communities.

For the most part, Little Free Libraries have more in common with book-sharing shelves. Those shelves might be found in coffee shops and other public spaces. Most are based on the idea of "take a book, leave a book." These little libraries can take many forms. They might be found in wooden structures to be reused on a long-term basis.

The Little Free Library organisation began in 2009. Todd Bol, a resident of Wisconsin, built a little model of a one-room schoolhouse. He filled it with books. Then he put it in his front yard. It was a tribute to show respect and gratitude to his late mother who was a teacher and a book lover. Together with a local educator named Rick Brooks, the two began setting up Little Free Libraries. They placed them across Wisconsin. Bol and Brooks also shared the idea with people across the country who were very interested. By 2011, there were at least 400 free libraries. "Something we need in this digital age is that connection between people," Bol explains. "I want to show how Little Free Library is about readers inspiring readers. It goes on and on."

Little Free Libraries might seem like a harmless and innocent means to promote reading and share books with neighbours. But at least a few of the roadside lending libraries have caused minor legal issues. According to the Los Angeles Times, officials have told some residents that their homemade libraries broke city laws. They would have to remove them. The little libraries' caretakers could pay fines if the lending libraries weren't removed.

How many things can you see in the night sky? On a clear night you might see the Moon, some planets and thousands of sparkling stars. You can see even more with a telescope. You might see stars where before you only saw dark space. With bigger and bigger telescopes you can see more and more objects in the sky. And you can see those objects in more and more detail.

But scientists believe that there are some things in the sky that we will never see even with the biggest telescope in the world. That is because they are invisible and **mysterious**. They are dead stars which are called black holes. You might find it hard to imagine that stars die. After all, our Sun is a star. Year after year we see it up in the sky, burning brightly, giving us heat and light. The Sun certainly doesn't seem to be getting old or weak. But stars do burn out and die after billions of years.

As a star's gases burn, they give off light and heat. But when the gas runs out, the star stops burning and begins to die. As the star cools, the outer layers of the star pull in toward the center. The star squashes into a smaller and smaller ball. If the star is very small, it ends up as a cold, dark ball called a black dwarf. If the star is very big, **it** becomes lesser and lesser until it's packed together tighter than anything else in the universe.

Imagine if the Earth were crushed until it was the size of a tiny marble. That's how tightly this dead star, a black hole, is packed. What pulls the star in toward its center with such power? It's the same force that pulls you down when you jump - the force called gravity. A black hole is so tightly packed that its gravity sucks in everything even light. The light from a black hole can never come back to your eyes. That's why you see nothing but blackness. So the next time you stare up at the night sky, remember: there's more in the sky than meets the eye!

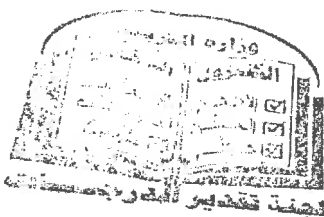
Katia Krafft was born in 1942 in France. She fell in love with volcanoes when she saw pictures of them. She studied geography at the University of Strasbourg, where she met her husband, Maurice Krafft. He is also a volcano fanatic.

Katia and Maurice started their own volcano center in 1968 and wrote many books that supported their trips all over the world. Katia started her career by taking gas samples of volcanoes. Maurice and Katia would document volcanoes erupting by observing them in person. Volcanoes are unpredictable and dangerous, and many scientists were too afraid to observe eruptions in person, but not Maurice and Katia. Throughout the 1970s and 1980s, they documented the volcanoes. Katia would photograph them while Maurice captured them on video. Katia wore a special helmet to protect her head from falling rocks.

Katia and Maurice's observations have led to a better understanding of volcanic eruptions. They took thickness measurements and gas readings and collected mineral samples just meters away from erupting volcanoes. They documented how these eruptions affected the ecosystems.

Together they witnessed and documented new volcanoes being formed, the effects of acid rain, and dangerous ash clouds. They even went on a small boat into a lake of acid to get proper readings. Their photography and videos allowed them to work with local governments on safety procedures. Some of their last videos were *Understanding Volcanic Hazards* and *Reducing Volcanic Risks*, but that did not mean they stopped being risk-takers. They continued to push the limits to get their observations, going closer to the volcano and staying longer during an eruption. In 1991, they were unlucky, and the volcano Mount Unzen in Japan took Katia and Maurice's lives, along with those of 41 other scientists and journalists, when the volcano flow changed direction.

Katia died doing what she loved with her husband. For years, she studied volcanoes right at their edge. Her courage and expertise have given us a greater understanding of volcanoes. The Krafft Medal is now given out to great volcanologists.

A study published in the medical journal, the Lancet has shown that there is a connection between good health and how near people live to a green area such as a park. The researchers found that there was a health benefit even when the green area was very small. For this reason, doctors in Britain want local councils to create more green areas so that more people will be encouraged to get outside.

Researchers at Columbia University in New York have found that when city streets are lined with trees, there are a lot of health benefits for children suffering from asthma. The researchers found that asthma rates in children aged between 4 and 5 decreased by 25% for every extra 343 trees per square kilometre. It is not clear why the rates of asthma decrease when there are more trees. It could be that the children are more likely to play outside or that the trees help reduce pollution. In any case, trees along city streets seem to be a good idea. This is why over the next few years the city of New York intends to plant another million trees.

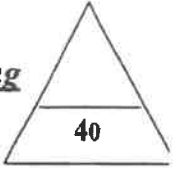

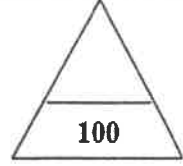

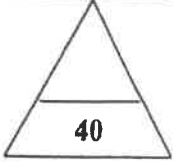
