Jamie Oliver wants to change peoples' lives and he is using food to do it. Oliver, a chef, is well-known for sharing his secrets of cooking healthy food through his magazine, cookbooks, and television shows. He is also changing lives through his Italian restaurant, Fifteen.



Fifteen started in London, England, as a place to train young adults to work in a kitchen. Oliver's idea was to create skillful chefs.

Every September, a new group of 18-24 year-olds start working at Fifteen. When they start, they are usually not **aualified** for a restaurant job, but that will change quickly. In the 12 months of training, the student chefs study cooking at college and get hands-on training at the restaurant. Besides learning kitchen skills, they learn the importance of using fresh ingredients and how to create their own dishes. And their education doesn't stop with preparing and serving food. 




