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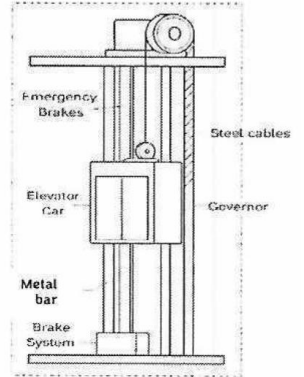

Passage:

Elevators play an important role in helping people and goods move up and down inside buildings. These machines are especially useful in tall buildings like hotels, office towers, and apartment complexes, where going up the stairs would be difficult or time-consuming. Every day, many people, especially those who have difficulty walking or cannot use stairs easily, rely on elevators to travel between floors quickly and comfortably.



Some people feel scared when they ride an elevator. They worry that the elevator might fall. But in real life, this almost never happens. Modern elevators are built and designed with many safety **features** to keep people safe. Elevators work with strong steel cables that are connected to a motor. The motor pulls the elevator up and lets it go down slowly and smoothly. Even one steel cable is strong enough to hold the elevator, but most elevators use several cables to be extra safe.

If something goes wrong with the cables, elevators still have protection. There is a special brake system that holds the metal bar strongly. This stops the elevator from falling. Elevators also have a device called a governor. **It** checks how fast the elevator is moving. If the elevator goes too fast, the governor turns on the brakes to stop it safely.

Elevators also have backup systems. If the power goes out, the elevator does not fall. However, it just stops and stays in place. Some elevators have batteries that help people get out safely during a power cut. Moreover, before elevators are used by people, engineers test all the parts like the cables, motor, and brakes. They make sure everything works well. Elevators also get regular maintenance to stay safe.

Sometimes, movies show elevators crashing. But this is not true in real life. Elevators are made with many safety layers. If an elevator stops suddenly, it is usually a small problem. You can press the help button to talk to someone and get help. Thanks to smart design and strong safety rules, elevators are one of the safest ways to travel between floors inside buildings.
