The Bald Eagle

The bald eagle is the national bird and symbol of the United States. A picture of the bald eagle is on many U.S. coins. Bald eagles are very large birds. Their wings can measure 7 feet (2.5 meters) across, and they can weigh up to 15 pounds (7 kilograms). They usually live near oceans or large lakes. They generally eat fish that they catch from the water. They live for 20 to 30 years in the wild. When they are about 5 years old, they choose a mate, or partner. They stay with this mate for the rest of their lives.



Bald eagles live only in North America. At one time there were many bald eagles in the United States. In the 1700s, there used to be 300,000 to 500,000 of them. But in the 1950s, there were less than 1,000 left in the U.S. (outside Alaska). Bald eagles became endangered because of people. They don't like to live near people, and as people spread across the U.S. the eagles were pushed out.

In 1976, the bald eagle was listed on the Endangered Species list. With careful laws to protect them, the population soon began to grow again. By 1992, there were 115,000 in the U.S. In 1995, the U.S. government was happy to remove the bald eagle from the Endangered Species list. The bald eagle is a good example of how we can save endangered species from extinction.
