#### Curling

Curling was made an official sport in the Winter Olympics in 1988. When spectators watched the first curling match in the Olympics, many people in the audience did not know anything about the game. They thought that it was a new sport. However, in spite of the fact that curling is little-known, it has been around for hundreds of years.

In the sport of curling, a team of players slide stones across the ice to reach a target spot. The stones are made of granite, a naturally-occurring hard rock. Each team throws eight stones. The stones that are closest to the target spot gain points for their team.

The name curling comes from the movement of the stones on the ice. When a stone was thrown, it would often curve, or curl, as it slid across the ice. This game involves more skill and strategy than it first appears. In fact, good players spend so much time thinking about where to throw their stone that curling has been referred to as "chess on ice." The stones need to be thrown skillfully to land in the target spot.

In the 1500s, curling was a recreational sport in Scotland. Friends and family gathered on frozen lakes, or *lochs* to play. They used ordinary flat stones that they gathered from the ground. A meteorologist is a scientist who studies and predicts the weather. In 2007, citizens in Kansas City conducted a study to find out how accurately their local meteorologists predicted the weather. First, the researchers asked a few TV meteorologists how well they thought they did their job. One said, "We have no idea what's going to happen [in the weather] beyond three days..." Another said, "All that viewers care about is the next day. Accuracy is not a big deal to viewers." In fact, these statements seem to be true. Research showed that weather predictions within a 48-hour period are very accurate. It is weather forecasts for three days later and beyond that are often wrong. In one instance, a meteorologist had made a prediction on Sunday that the following Saturday would be 53 degrees Fahrenheit. By Friday, the forecast had changed to 84 degrees Fahrenheit! In reality, it was 81 degrees Fahrenheit on that Saturday.

Also in this study, television stations were asked what qualifications they look for when they hire a new meteorologist. One TV station manager replied, "There's not an evaluation of accuracy in hiring meteorologists. Presentation takes precedence over accuracy." In other words, TV stations like to hire meteorologists who are attractive and entertaining. Weather forecasters who are fun to watch, but who don't necessarily make accurate predictions get more viewers than forecasters who are boring to watch but make better predictions.

The conclusion to this study was that it might be the public's fault that we often receive bad weather forecasts. Viewers should let TV stations know that they would rather watch meteorologists who give accurate forecasts. Then, viewers can change the channel to watch a movie for entertainment. And, remember: Don't change your weekend plans based on the weather report! Wait until one day before to trust your local weather forecast.
