1) The first Oxford and Cambridge Boat Race was held at Henley-on-Thames in 1829. That's when two old school friends, Charles Wordsworth, who went to Oxford University, and Charles Merrivale, who went to Cambridge University, decided to challenge each other to a boat race. Oxford won the race easily and the winning boat is on display at the River & Rowing Museum in Henley.

2) The race has been held annually since then, except during the two World Wars and the COVID-19 pandemic. The loser of the race traditionally challenges the winner to a re-match every year. The race takes place on the River Thames in London, where it is a tradition for the universities to compete in a demanding four-mile rowing race. With each team celebrating an impressive number of wins, the competition between the Oxford and Cambridge universities remains very strong.

3) The race has become a significant event in British sporting culture and is watched with excitement by millions of people. It is subject to huge media coverage with locals gathering along the river bank to cheer on the rowers. 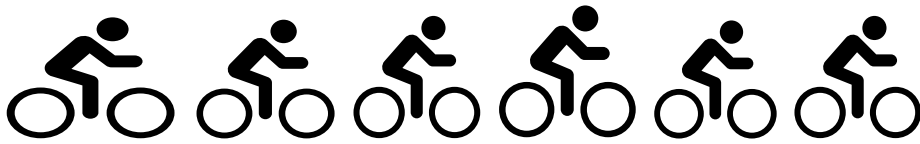
