Aspire Tower

Aspire Tower, also known as the Torch Doha, is a 300-metre-tall (980 ft) skyscrapers hotel located in the Aspire zone complex in Doha, Qatar. Designed by architect Haddi Simaan, ARAP, engineer over Arup and partners. The tower was the main centre for the 15th Asian Games in Qatar in December 2006.

The tower is Currently the tallest building in Doha and Qatar. The tower has been known as Khalifa Sports Tower or Doha Olympic Tower.

The whole building is made of steel, metal, concrete and glass walls. The building was completed in November 2007 at a final cost of \$ 133,395,000. There is a cantilevered swimming pool eighty meters high. There is also a revolving restaurant. This restaurant serves Italian, French, And Qatari food. You can see whole Qatar from there.

Sidra Medical and Research Centre is a 400- bed hospital, medical education center in Qatar Foundation. It works with the help of a medical college in Qatar. The hospital was opened in January 2018 with 400 beds. In the future, it will serve more than 275,000 patients per year.

Sidra is located in Education City, by Qatar Foundations.

Outside the hospital, there are 14 giant bronze sculptures by Damien Hirst called The Miraculous Journey. They show the stages of a baby before birth. They are owned by the Qatar Foundation. Qatar Foundation pays \$ 7.9 billion budget for hospital's constructions.

Biomedical research first began at Sidra in 2015. Outpatient care started May 2016. In 2017, more than 25,000 people were treated at the hospital's outpatient clinic.

There are 3,900 staff members working in Sidra hospital.

Future plans will add more 500 beds to the hospital.

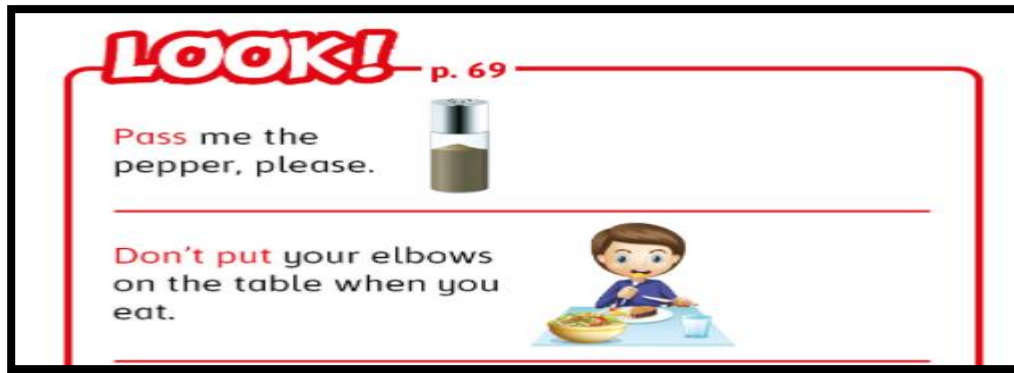

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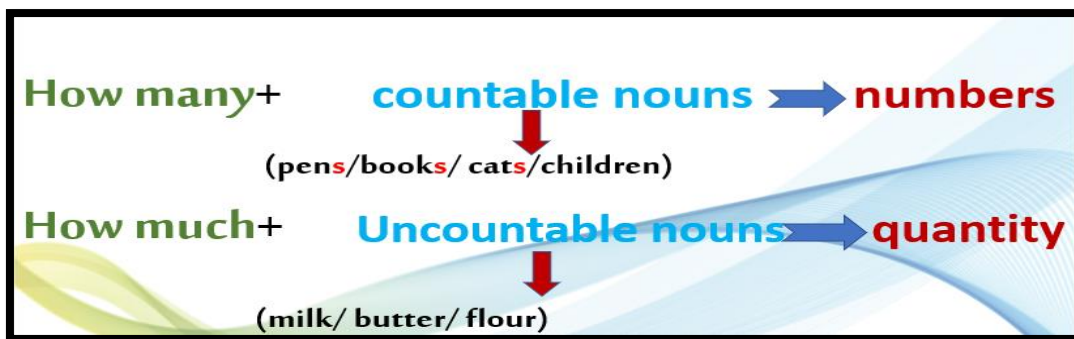
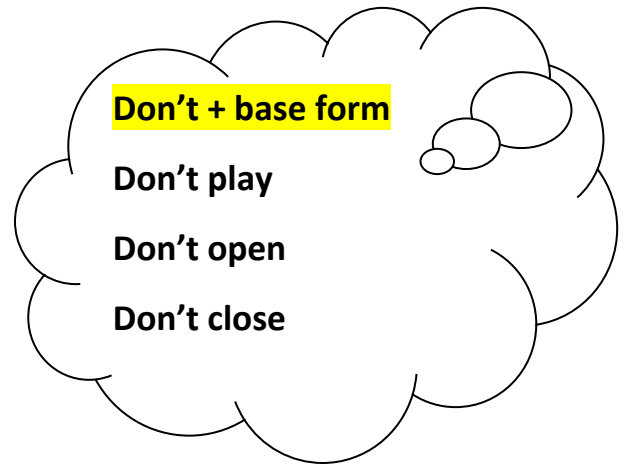
