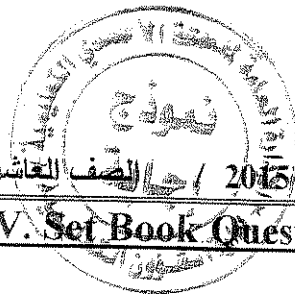

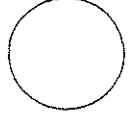

Did you sleep well last night? Or did you wake up feeling fatigued and slow-moving, perhaps even wondering if you really slept at all? Getting a good night's sleep requires more than crawling into bed and closing your eyes. Understanding your sleep behavior and preparing for a sound sleep can help make sure every night is a good night for sleeping.

Research has found that people sleep better at different times daily. For example, some people function better if they go to sleep early and rise early, while others feel more rested if they stay up late and sleep in. Yet delaying or altering the time you go to sleep can have a major impact on how you feel when you wake up. The amount of sleep the average adult needs each night also varies. Landis points out that those who follow a regular sleep schedule are more likely to function better on fewer hours, but she adds that most adults need at least six hours of sleep each night.

A person's sleeping routine is not always the same. Gradually altering the timing of sleep can help change sleep patterns. An "evening person" who needs to get to work early in the morning can try increasing the time he goes to bed by 30 minutes every few days. Within a few weeks, this slow change will help "reset" the internal body clock. Once your body clock has decided its time to rest, it works with other functions in the body to help prepare you for the night of sleep ahead, stopping the various bodily functions associated with being awake.

"But how can you sleep well? Simply, by maintaining a regular daily sleep schedule. Moreover, it is important to avoid stimulants like caffeinated beverages and food such as chocolate in the late afternoon and evening.
