Crocodiles mostly feed on fish, birds, turtles and other small animals by catching them and pulling them to the water. When a female crocodile is ready to lay eggs, it builds a small nest from mud and dead plants. Some types of crocodiles can lay more than 100 eggs. When they hatch, it stays with its babies for weeks to protect them.

They have special part in their bodies that pushes the salt out of their beaks. A group of penguins that lives together is called " a colony ". Penguins find their food in the water too. They eat fish, shrimps, squids and other forms of sea life which they catch with their beaks and swallow while swimming.

Most people think that penguins live in very cold places like Antaractica, but they also live on the coasts of south America, Africa and Australia. They spend half of their lives on land and the other half in the sea. The largest living penguin is called 'emperor penguin'. It's about 1.1 m tall and weighs 35 kg. The smallest penguin is the 'little blue penguin' also known as the "fairy" penguin which stands around 30- 33 cm tall and 1.3 kg. Interestingly, penguins have no special fear of humans and often approach groups of people because humans don't usually hunt them. They have also been a good subject for films and cartoons. They are lovely birds.
