## Modals

Modal verbs are 'auxiliary' verbs like shall, should, can, could, will, would, mav, might. We use them before main verbs, for example: We should respect our elders.

Modal verbs are used for different purposes.

| Purpose | Example |
| :---: | :---: |
| Asking for and giving advice | Should I take off my shoes? |
| Offering to do something | Can I help you? |
| Permission | Can I use the phone? |
| Requests | Can you pass the salt? |

| Asking for and giving advice | May I have the salt, please? |
| Offering to do something | This bag looks heavy, Mr. Ahmad, Can I help you? |
| Permission | You should drink some water. |
| Requests | May I go to bathroom? |
